

Technology

The Bay Area remains the strongest and most resilient technology market in the nation. Five of the six biggest public market debuts in tech last year were from Bay Area companies and the sixth company, Palantir, just moved away from the region.

The 20th annual CompTIA Cyberstates report ranked the San Francisco metropolitan area 1st nationally for tech jobs added in 2020 and 2nd for economic impact of the area's tech sector. Silicon Valley ranked 4th nationally for tech jobs added in 2020 and 1st for economic impact. The Bay Area tech industry contributes over \$354B to the local economy.

Silicon Valley is home to many of the world's largest technology companies including Apple, Cisco, Google, HP, Intel and Oracle. The term originally referred to the region's large number of silicon chip innovators and manufacturers, but eventually came to refer to all the high-tech businesses in the area; it is now generally used as a metonym for the American high-tech sector. Despite the development of other high-tech economic centers throughout the United States and the world, Silicon Valley continues to be the leading hub for high-tech innovation and development, accounting for one third of all venture capital investment in the United States.

The rise of Silicon Valley was bolstered by the development of appropriate legal infrastructure to support the rapid formation, funding and expansion of high-tech companies, as well as the development of a critical mass of litigators and judges experienced in resolving disputes between such firms. From the early 1980s onward, many national (and later international) law firms opened offices in San Francisco and Palo Alto in order to provide Silicon Valley startups with legal services. Furthermore, California law has a number of quirks which help entrepreneurs establish startups at the expense of established firms, such as a nearly absolute ban on non-compete clauses in employment agreements.




